Abstract: This collection contains papers, documents, and photographs amassed by Karl O. Werwath during his presidency at the Milwaukee School of Engineering (MSOE) from 1948 to 1977.

Biography: Karl O. Werwath was born on March 1, 1909 to parents Oscar and Johanna Werwath. He took over presidency of MSOE from his father, Oscar Werwath in 1948, and turned it over to Robert Spitzer in 1977. Karl suffered a heart attack at age 70 on August 30, 1979.

Karl is credited with being a passionate spokesman for the promotion of technical education and its important contributions to American industry. Under his presidency, enrollment at MSOE grew to include students from across the U.S. and 30 countries. He was also highly active in professional engineering societies and associations (see below for an abbreviated list).

Scope and Content Note: This collection contains typewritten documents, photographs, published works from magazines and newspapers, pamphlets from area industries, blueprints, and reproduced documents. These documents are representative of administrative processes, as well as professional interests and associations throughout Karl Werwath's 30-year presidency at the Milwaukee School of Engineering.

Arrangement: When this collection was originally accessioned, it had been subject to multiple organization schemes did not completely adhere to any single arrangement. Owing to that fact, it was not feasible to keep the original order of the collection intact during processing. Many of the original folder titles were carried over into the new organization scheme, and effort was made to retain the original order of documents within the folders when possible.

The folders themselves are arranged within series chronologically and alphabetically within similar dates. Folders with inclusive date ranges are arranged before those with assorted dates.

Series Summaries

Series 1: Administrative (Folders 1 – 184): This series contains all documents concerned with the day-to-day activities associated with running the school.

Financial: Heinz Werwath was in charge of the school's finances during much of Karl's presidency. There is some overlap with Heinz-related records here (see: Heinz Werwath Collection), but the documents were included in this collection because they arrived with Karl's records. Therefore, it is presumed that these were Karl's copies of the documents. [Restricted due to sensitive nature of the information.]

Forms/Policies: Blank forms and policy sheets for policies and procedures at MSOE.

Faculty: Faculty lists, teaching schedules, payroll information, and résumés. [Restricted due to sensitive nature of the information.]

Committees: Minutes and documentation of committees related to the administrative decisions of MSOE.

Buildings: Financial records relating to campus building projects, remodeling, specific fund raising efforts, proposed buildings, and completed buildings. Additional information about campus buildings may be found in the separate "Buildings and Facilities" collection.

Series 2: Enrollment/Admissions/Registration (Folders 185 – 284): This series includes all paperwork related to student enrollment, admissions, and registration. Records of academic performance and personal information may also be found in this series. Heinz was also in charge of enrollment and registration. For the most part these documents contain various lists of student data arranged by year, original location, intended major, completed major, etc. These documents were left with the collection because they are Karl's copies, although they are likely duplicated in Heinz's collection. [Restricted due to sensitive nature of the information.]

Series 3: Academics (Folders 285 – 477): This series includes information on internal programs of the school (departmental minutes) as well as specific class information (syllabi, course outlines).

Series 4: Associations (Folders 478 – 588):

Associations of Interest to K.O.W.: It is difficult to distinguish between the professional associations of which Karl was an active member, those in which he took a vested interest, and those for which he simply received the literature. The range of dates for each association should indicate Karl's level of interest and/or involvement with the group.

AAEF –Administrative and Members: Associated Alumni Endowment Fund. This MSOE association has its own series because it has a significant amount of documentation and member records. The Administrative Documents Subseries consists of meeting minutes and financial information. The Member Records Subseries consists of records of dues paid, membership dates, and address changes.

Series 5: Events (Folders 654 – 691): This series contains records of events ranging from MSOE commencement and President's Day, to conventions held by major engineering associations. Typically the topics in this series may be related to a single day or a couple of consecutive days.

Series 6: Correspondence (Folders 692 – 821): This series includes letters written to and from Karl. The items in these folders are those which were separated into separate folders in the original order of the collection. Often, subject-based letters are kept with other documents related to that topic and placed in the corresponding series (ex: letters from a specific air force base have been kept with related information).

"General Correspondence" is used as a title for folders of communications related to extremely general activities of the president (inter-office communications, for example), and letters for which there are no additional items containing the same theme, recipient, sender, or topic.

Within the years 1955 and 1956 there are two large chunks of "General Correspondence" folders-- this is due to the fact that the communications therein showed little intuitive order, and as such have been left in the original order. In 1956, however, these large folders were loosely alphabetized by correspondent. This (unorganized beyond initial letter) order has been preserved.

Series 7: Karl O. Werwath (Folders 822 – 923): This series contains published and unpublished articles and speeches written by Karl (indicated with [K.O.W.] in the folder titles). It also contains writings directly about Karl's life and achievements, and official personal documents (marriage certificate, photocopy of birth certificate, etc). Dates for unlabelled photographs were estimated. When dates were indicated on the photographs, they were included in the folder title.

The folder "[K.O.W.] Published and Unpublished Speeches" was taken from its binder but kept in original order. Many of the speeches contained in this folder are repeated in the separate speech folders, arranged by title.

Series 8: Awards (Folders 924 – 941): Records of awards won by Karl O. Werwath and those dedicated to him during the course of his career.

Series 9: Resources (Folders 942 – 1010): This series consists of resources saved by Karl for use in speeches and for informational value. Many of these documents relate to other technical institutes, advances in industry/engineering, and resources related to major Milwaukee

businesses. Some of the folder titles are vague because many of these documents arrived with Karl's collection in full folders, labeled generic things like "Misc. Resources" and "Speech Materials."

Newspaper clippings with potential historical value have been labeled by title/subject. Additional folders of clippings are those of personal interest to Karl.

Series including MSOE financial materials, faculty personal information, and student information have been restricted.
